Businesses and individuals can purchase one or more of the flags to be placed on Elida Road, State Route 66 in front of Jefferson High School, in front of St. John's Church and Schools and at the Veterans Memorial park at Fifth and Main streets during flag holidays (Memorial Day, Flag Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Patriotic Day (9/11) and Labor Day. They can also be purchased to be placed at the home of a soldier returning stateside

"These flags provide a powerful, silent but visible display of community pride," project co-chair Jay Metzner said.
