### June 10 — The Ohio Valley British Brass Band

The Ohio Valley British Brass Band was founded in February 1992 by Francis Laws and the late Ed Nickol, and since January 2009 has been under the leadership of music director Michael Gallehue. The 45-member ensemble is comprised of professional musicians, active as well as retired educators at the secondary and collegiate levels, students, and lay people from the Ohio Valley. The band's mission is to perform a variety of worthwhile and engaging literature while providing an opportunity for the area's finest brass players to participate in a quality musical ensemble.

Since its inception the OVBBB has played extensively throughout southwestern Ohio and northern Kentucky, including featured performances with the Cincinnati Pops and Dayton Philharmonic Orchestras. The OVBBB has also performed for the Ohio Music Education Association Professional Development Conference, the American School Band Directors Association State Convention, and was the keynote performing ensemble at the Wisconsin Brass Band Festival in Oshkosh, Wisconsin. The band plays a variety of musical repertoire, appropriate and suitable to its audience—including marches, overtures, show tunes, light classics, and patriotic selections.

parents, a local attorney, who had attended that meeting. He said that two of his elderly clients had expressed an interest in helping to nurture the musical arts at Findlay High School and asked him if he had any suggestions! After meeting with the couple and their attorney, they made a donation of \$10,000 toward the start-up costs of a new steelband. With an additional \$6,000 from various other donors we were able to purchase two of each “voice” (lead, seconds, cellos, and bass) from Panyard, Inc. of Akron, Ohio. This also included all stands, cases, mallets, 12 music arrangements, and a variety of miscellaneous percussion instruments. As of January 2003, the band has expanded to 35 pans covering 14 voices, a new drum set, and an estimated value of over \$70,000. We are very thankful to our community for its support of the arts in public education. Without it this dream of a steelband would have remained just that.”

### Aug. 26 — “Dan Heath with the Paradise Band”

The song list for Dan Heath with the Paradise Band is inspired by the great jazz and pop standards from the 1920’s through the mid-seventies. This allows the band great latitude in mood, tempo, style and genre. While the band does “cover” a number of songs, the band also arranges a number of its songs to fit the fine musical abilities of the instrumentalists.

The “jazz” aspect of the band comes into play when the vocal goes out and free-wheeling, creative instrumentals take over. The band then is “inspired” by a number of song stylists, song writers and band arrangers. Those stylists include Sinatra, Nat King Cole, Tony Bennett, Bobby Darin, Elvis, the Beatles and other 50’s and 60’s pop/rock groups. Song writers like Cole Porter, Johnny Mercer, Gus Kahn and Jimmy Van Heusen dominate the song list while arrangers like Nelson Riddle play a great influence in the band’s arrangements. Broadway musicals also play a role in the band’s song list.

The Paradise Band consists of some of the finest musicians in the Fort Wayne area. Steve Walley provides the keyboard work for the band. Steve has a Master’s Degree in Music. Terry Vaughn is a great Fort Wayne area drummer. Bob Ferguson, a well-known Fort Wayne area guitarist adds his great guitar work for the band. Bob also has his Master’s Degree in Music from Indiana University at Bloomington. Rick Brown is a well known Fort Wayne area saxophone player and when Rick isn’t available, David Blackwell provides his very fine sax and clarinet work. Finally, Brad Kuhns provides bass for the band. Brad is also a bass player with the Fort Wayne Philharmonic.
